





EQUIPMENT

- Action Plan
- Pen and paper
- Hand cleaner
- Newborn simulator
- Gloves
- Clock
- Head covering (for baby)
- Cloths (dry and clean)
- Cord ties/clamps
- Stethoscope
- Ventilation bag and mask
- Suction device
- Scissors
- Thermometer
- Syringe



HOW TO USE THE SIMULATION PRACTICE CARDS

- 1. Work in groups of two or three
- 2. Choose the case you want to practice
- 3. Find the necessary equipment
- 4. Choose roles and start the exercise

Mother:


- Read the case
- Engages with the simulator, ask questions, give prompts as needed

Provider:

- Demonstrate action step without looking at checklist (look at the Action Plan)
- Communicate with the mother (and the helper).

Helper (optional):

- Give prompts as needed.
- 5. Participants switch roles and repeat the exercise
- 6. When the exercise is finished, review the action steps and Discuss together:
 - Provider/s review the action steps and reflect on their performance.
 - Mother/s and helper/s give comments to improve performance and show steps that were missed during the exercise.





CASE 1: Preparation for birth

As the mother (or helper), read out loud to the provider:


"A mother in labour is now 8 cm dilated. Show how you will prepare for birth of the baby and communicate with the mother."

<u>Provider</u> Demonstrate action steps and communicate	Mother (or helper) If action is not done, use the prompts to provide hint
Welcome mother and assessAssess risk factors	"Who are you?"
 Prepare for birth Identify a helper and review the emergency plan Prepare the area for delivery Wash hands Prepare an area for ventilation 	"Is there anyone who can help you?" "I am cold." or "The room is very dark." "Your hands are dirty." or "My hands are dirty." "What if my baby needs help to breathe?"
 Check equipment Assemble disinfected equipment Test the ventilation bag, mask and suction device Check that a uterotonic is prepared for the mother 	"Do you need things to help my baby?" "Is everything working?" "Will I be OK?"

CASE 2: Routine care

As the mother (or helper), read out loud to the provider:


"A baby is born. Show how you will care for a baby who is crying and breathing well, and communicate with the mother."

 Remove wet cloth Recognize crying/ breathing well 	"My baby is wet." "Is my baby OK?"

☐ Check breathing☐ Give mother uterotonic✔ Check for bleeding	"Should I get some medication?"	
☐ Clamp and cut cord	"When do you cut my baby's cord?"

CASE 3: The Golden Minute

Stimulate breathing and clear the airway if needed

As the mother (or helper), read out loud to the provider:


"A baby is born. Show how you will care for the baby who is NOT crying or breathing well.

Communicate with the mother."

<u>Provider</u> Demonstrate action steps and communicate	Mother (or helper) If action is not done, use the prompts to provide hint

CASE 4: The Golden Minute

Ventilate

As the mother (or helper), read out loud to the provider:

"A baby is born. Show how you will care for the baby who is NOT crying or breathing well.


Communicate with the mother."

 Continue skin-to-skin care and monitor temperature breathing mother for bleeding

CASE 5: Improve ventilation


As the mother (or helper), read out loud to the provider:

"A baby is not breathing, you start ventilation and there is no chest movement. Show how you will care for the baby and communicate with the mother."

<u>Provider</u> Demonstrate action steps and communicate	Mother (or helper) If action is not done, use the prompts to provide hint
☐ Recognize not crying/ not breathing☐ Recognize chest not moving	"Is my baby OK?"
 ☐ Improve ventilation - Reapply mask - Reposition head - Clear mouth and nose - Open mouth - Squeeze the bag harder ☐ Recognize breathing 	"Is my baby OK? IF PROVIDER ASKS, say:
 □ Continue skin-to-skin care and monitor with mother - breathing, color, heart rate - temperature - bleeding (mother) 	"The baby is breathing now."
 Help initiate breastfeeding Communicate with mother and family Continue essential newborn care, identify the baby, complete birth record 	"What happened?"

CASE 6: Decide on advanced care

As the mother (or helper), read out loud to the provider:

"A baby is not breathing, but has chest movement with bag and mask ventilation. Show how you will care for the baby and communicate with the mother."

<u>Provider</u> Demonstrate action steps and communicate	Mother (or helper) If action is not done, use the prompts to provide hint	
☐ Recognize not breathing☐ Recognize slow heart rate	"Is my baby OK?" IF PROVIDER ASKS, say: "Heart rate is 70."	
☐ Continue ventilation☐ Recognize not breathing☐ Recognize normal heart rate	"Is my baby OK?" IF PROVIDER ASKS, say: "Heart rate is 120."	
Decide on advanced careCommunicate with mother and family	"What happened?"	
Record dataPrepare referral note	"What do I tell the new doctor?"
