# **PAYMENT/MONEY MANAGEMENT ACCOUNTS**

(**EXAMPLE**: Venmo®)



Money associated with a payment or investment account (E-Trade®, etc.) needs to be officially rolled into the estate like all other financial assets.

It's up to the executor to make sure this happens correctly.
