Eligibility highlights

- New Ventures are eligible
- Locations can be up to 50,000 sqft

Account parameters

- Up to \$250,000 for BPP
- No more than three claims in the last five years, and no more than \$20,000 total incurred (CAT claims not counted)

Rating highlights

- Artisan Makers classes are rated by annual revenue
- Risk should be valued at 100% replacement cost

Coverage highlights

- Business Income from Dependent Properties: \$10,000
- Personal Property off Premises provided automatically in the enhancement form
- Limits for theft for specified items is higher in the enhancement form than normally provided by an ISO base form

Ineligible:

True Manufacturing: made with a true machinery exposure, is mass made in a factory, or is made by a third party outside of the United States

Textile makers: must comply with all flammability standards set by the Consumer Product Safety Commission and the Standard for the Flammability of Clothing Textiles found in the Flammable Fabrics Act and all applicable regulations and standards set by the FTC.

Food Makers: Products must be tested, designed, labeled, and manufactured to meet minimum standards of disclosure of allergens under the Federal Food Allergen Labeling and Consumer Protection Act (FALCPA)

Must never have been investigated by the FDA
Must have proper labeling of potential allergens and warning labels present on finished product

No:

Prior product recalls
Farming or agricultural operations
Products designed for infants
Products designed to promote health benefits
Importing of their products
Building coverage is allowed
Violations or fines from any governmental agency in the last 3 years.
