Blood Pressure Log for an Upcoming Appointment

If you have an upcoming clinic or telehealth visit to discuss your blood pressure, follow the guidelines on the document titled "Measuring Your Blood Pressure at Home" to take your blood pressure in the morning and the evening for at least three days prior to the appointment (taking two readings each time for a total of 12 readings). Having this information is very useful to your provider.

If you do not have your blood pressure monitor connected to your MyChart account for automatic upload of the readings, the table below can help you document these prior to your appointment. After you've documented all 12 readings over three days, an average reading can be determined*.
