A candidate's eligibility for support from HALPAC is reviewed by the HALPAC Board, which considers the candidate's record on business-related issues; leadership and committee assignments for which the candidate might be eligible; the extent of Halliburton Company's facilities and employees within the candidate's district and state; and finally, the candidate's chances of being elected. Suggestions by employees are invited.
