We are pleased to share with you the 2017 Halliburton Political Action Committee (HALPAC) Annual Report. The report lists federal and state level candidates that HALPAC supported last year.

In 2017, HALPAC made \$384,550 in contributions to 101 candidates and three federal leadership PACs, a more than 56% increase in giving from our last non-election year, 2015.

As we head into the 2018 midterm elections, HALPAC will continue to identify and support those elected officials who can bring positive changes to the legislative process. HALPAC will look to highlight the benefits of employee engagement in the political process and the value-add provided to HALPAC members through the PAC-Match program that supports hundreds of charitable organizations each year.

2018 promises many changes at the legislative level, with some of our biggest industry champions choosing not to run for re-election. A candidate's eligibility for support from HALPAC is reviewed by the HALPAC Board, which considers the candidate's record on business-related issues; leadership and committee assignments for which the candidate might be eligible; the extent of Halliburton Company's facilities and employees within the candidate's district and state; and finally, the candidate's chances of being elected. Suggestions of employees are invited.
