

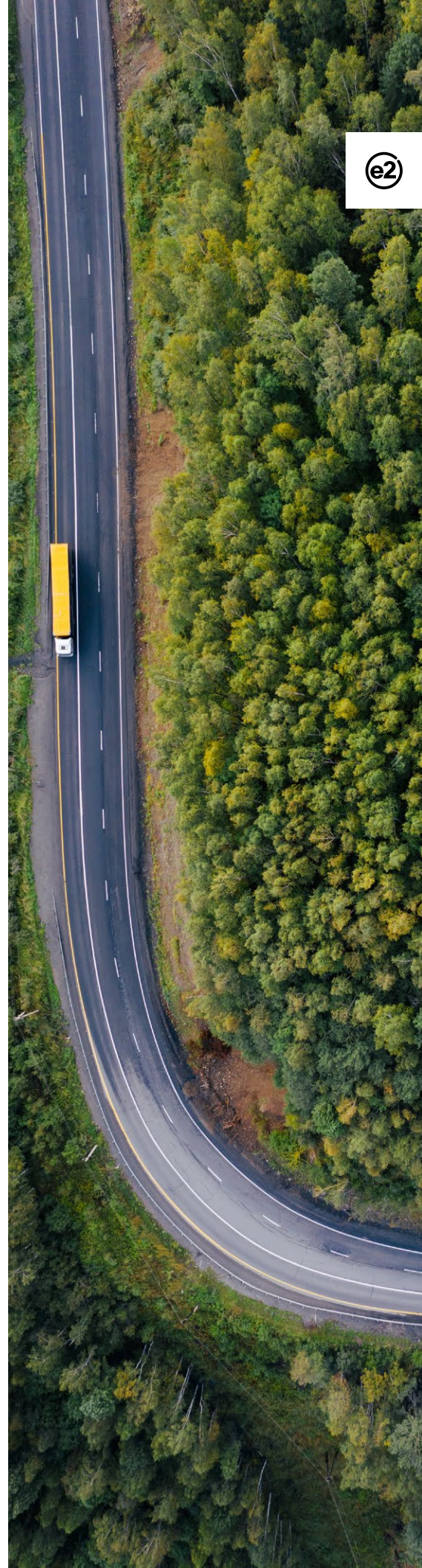
EUDR Compliance: Connecting Supplier Data, Due Diligence, and Traceability

The **European Union Deforestation Regulation** (EUDR) is raising expectations for companies to prove sourcing transparency, supplier accountability, and product-level due diligence at scale. The goal is clear: comply with the regulation and be able to demonstrate compliance with reliable evidence.

Understand the current EUDR due diligence requirements and timing

EUDR raises the standard for proving that in-scope products are deforestation-free, legally produced, and supported by due diligence records. The regulation applies to commodities such as cattle, cocoa, coffee, palm oil, rubber, soy, and wood. It also covers certain derived products placed on, made available in, or exported from the EU market.





Grouping	Current timing	What organizations need to be ready to do
Large and medium operators and traders	30 December 2026	Collect required supplier and geolocation data. Assess risk, maintain records, and submit due diligence statements before market placement or export.
Micro and small operators	30 June 2027	Use the extended timeline to prepare data, supplier engagement, and due diligence processes.
Micro and small operators already covered by the EU Timber Regulation	30 December 2026	Meet the earlier compliance date for timber-related products already covered by the prior timber framework.

The execution challenge is clear: companies must identify which products are in scope, engage suppliers, collect evidence, assess risk, and retain supporting records. They also need to support regulatory submissions without depending on manual follow-up across disconnected systems.

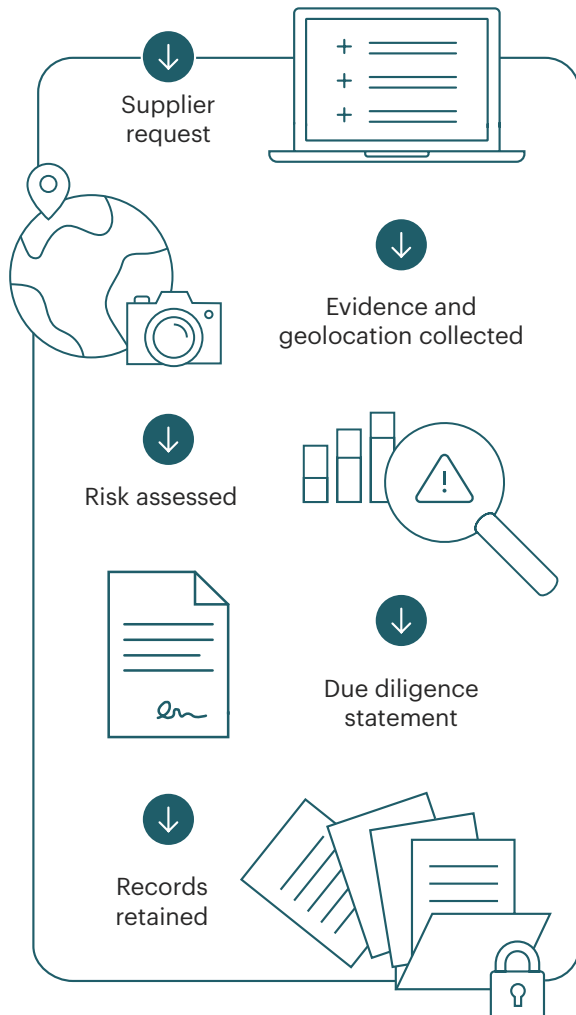

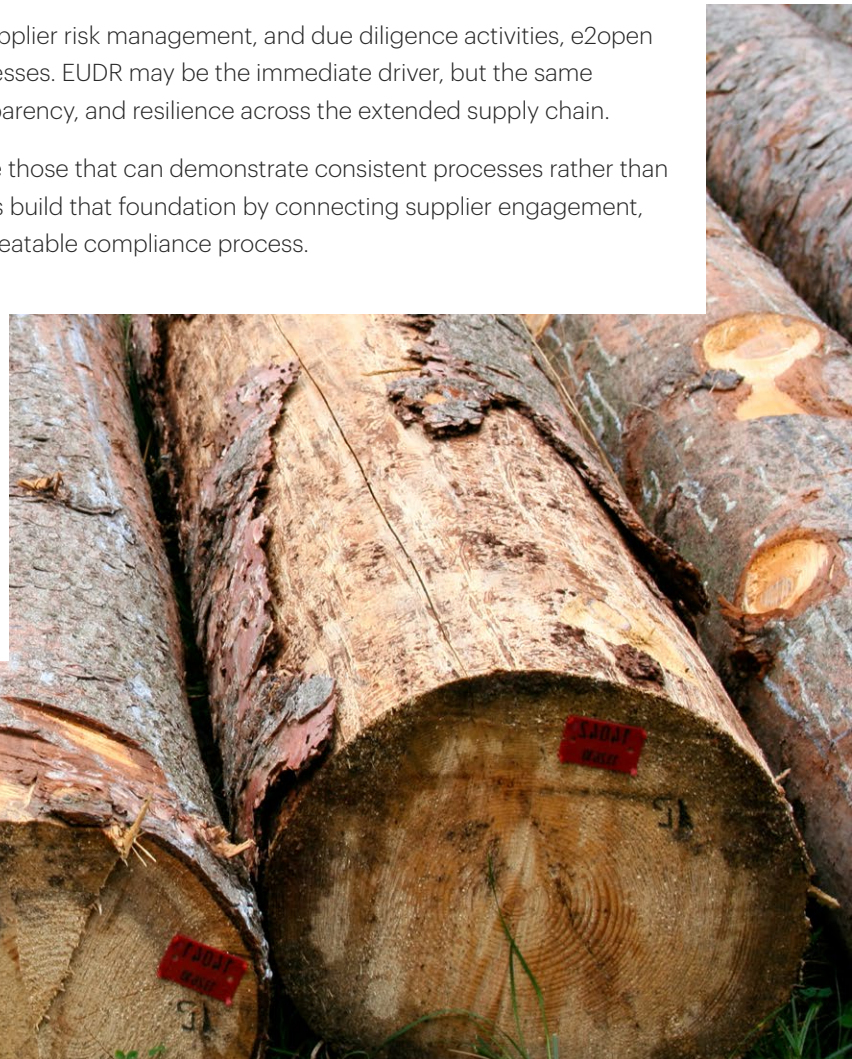
