Platter Standards

Simple shapes. Boundless possibilities.

The Platter Standards offer a collection of familiar forms, waiting to be arranged into something entirely your own. Mix them, repeat them, scale them. The composition is yours to write. What follows are the dimensions and details - everything you need to start.



Standard Shapes

Design

Nine familiar forms, endless ways to arrange them. Each shape is ready for Turf's Fast Track, so once you've found your composition, your project can move straight into production.

1" Gap Between Panels

Give your panels room to breathe. We recommend a minimum 1" gap between adjacent panels as you lay out your design -standard shapes don't include mending hatch doors, so this spacing keeps your composition clean and buildable.

Cardboard Layout & Connections

Standard shapes ship with a cardboard layout template, mapping out exactly where your connection points should go. You can plan your install with confidence before a single panel goes up.

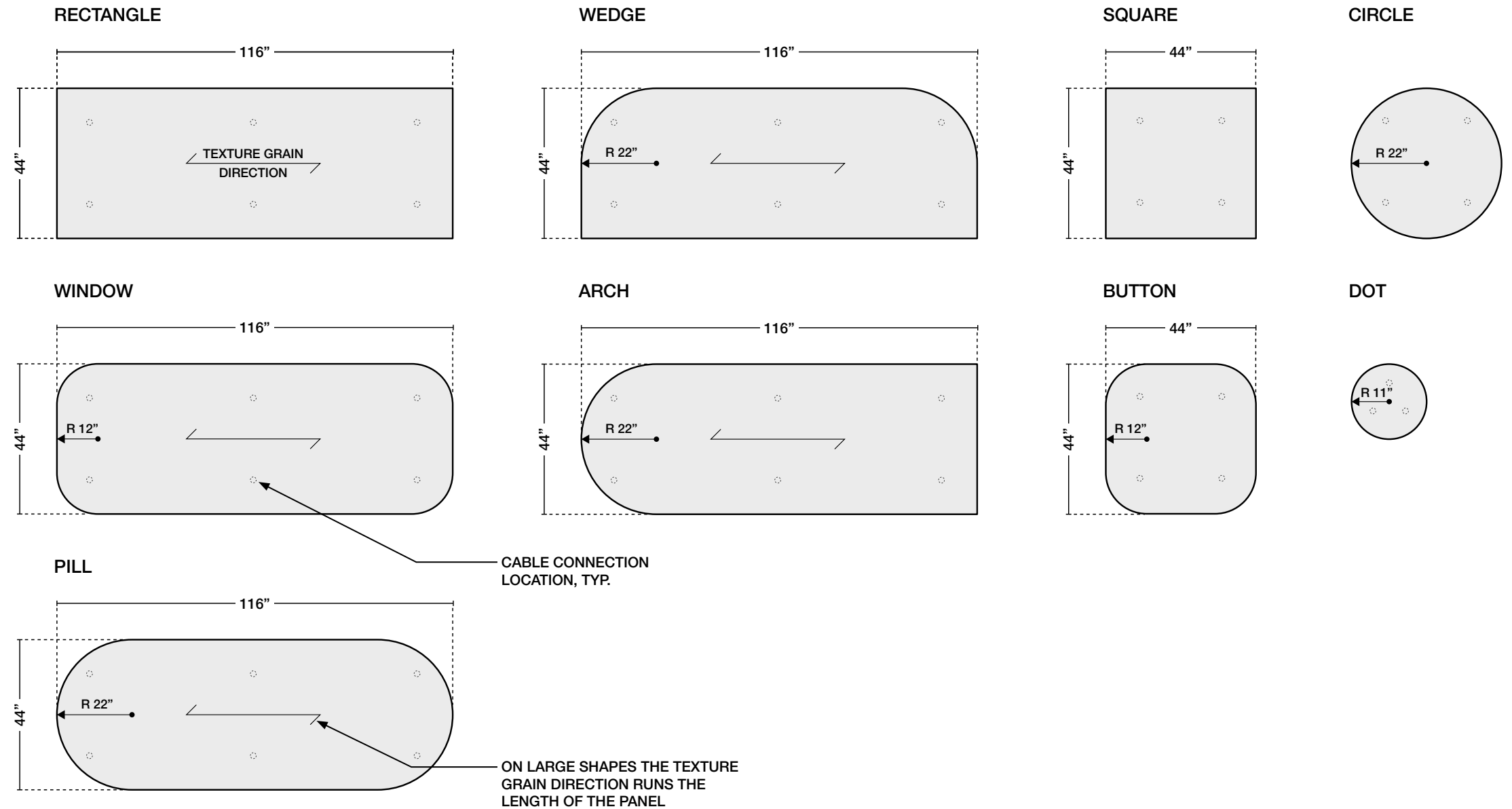

Cable Locations

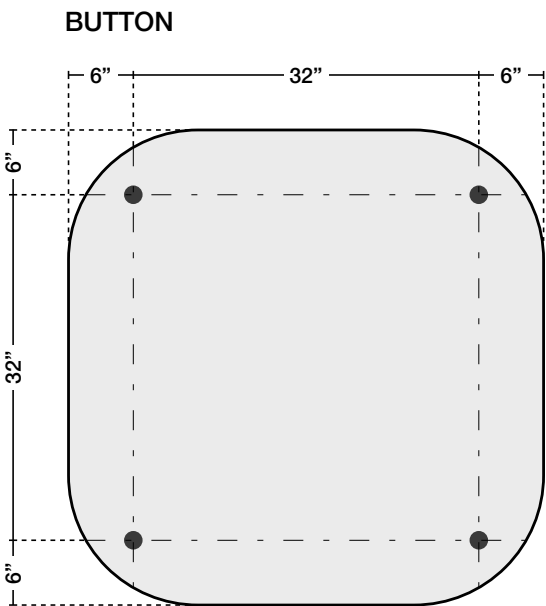
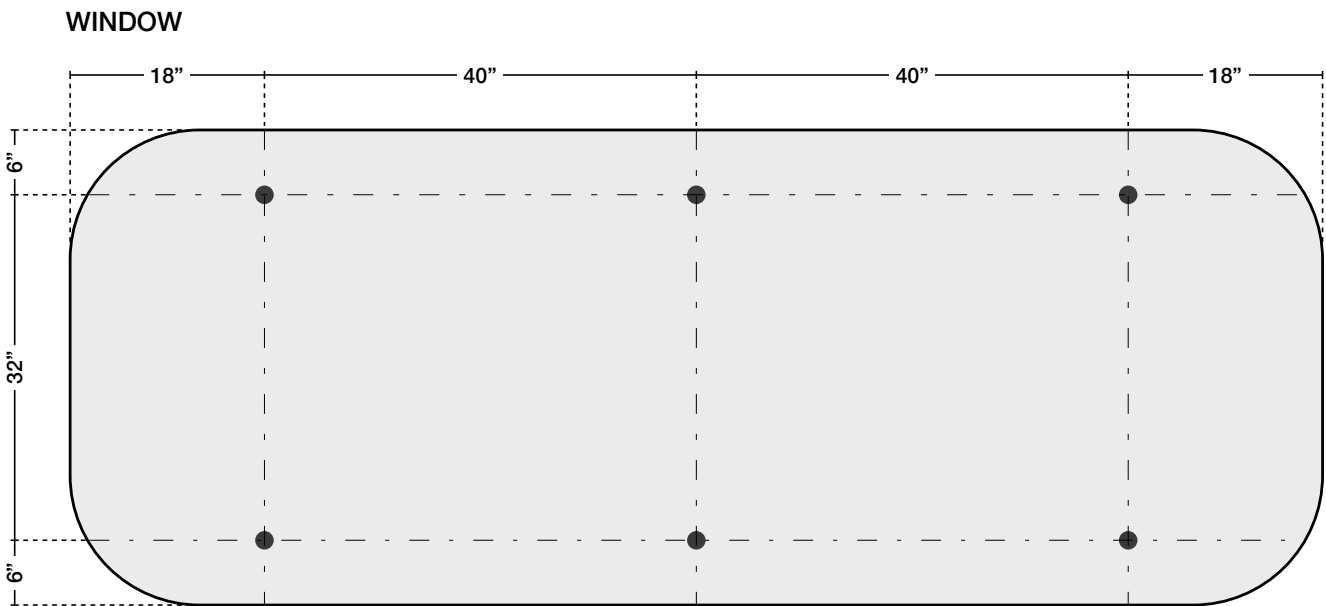
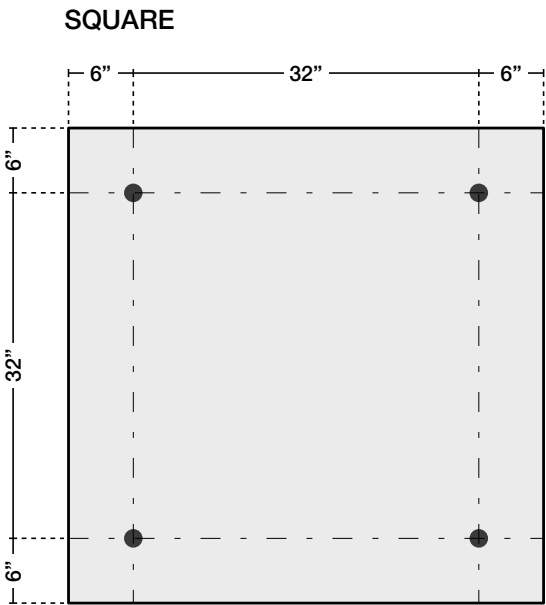
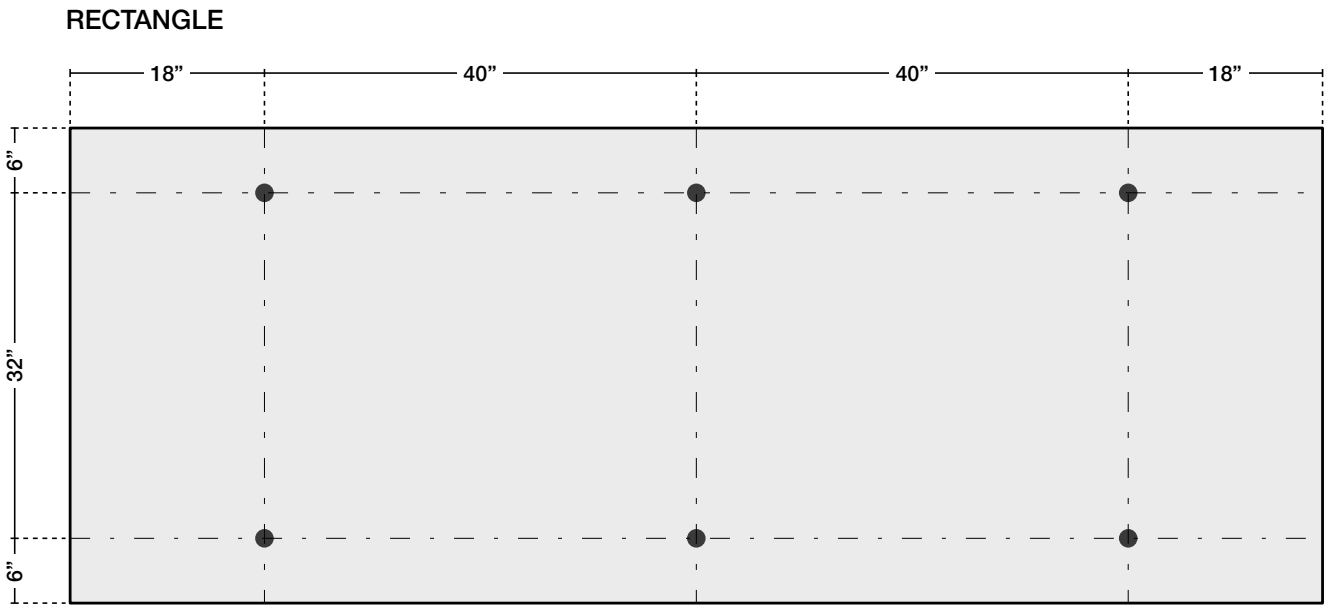
Here's exactly where your cable connections land on each shape to ensure wiring your layout is as straightforward as the design itself.

Moving Connections

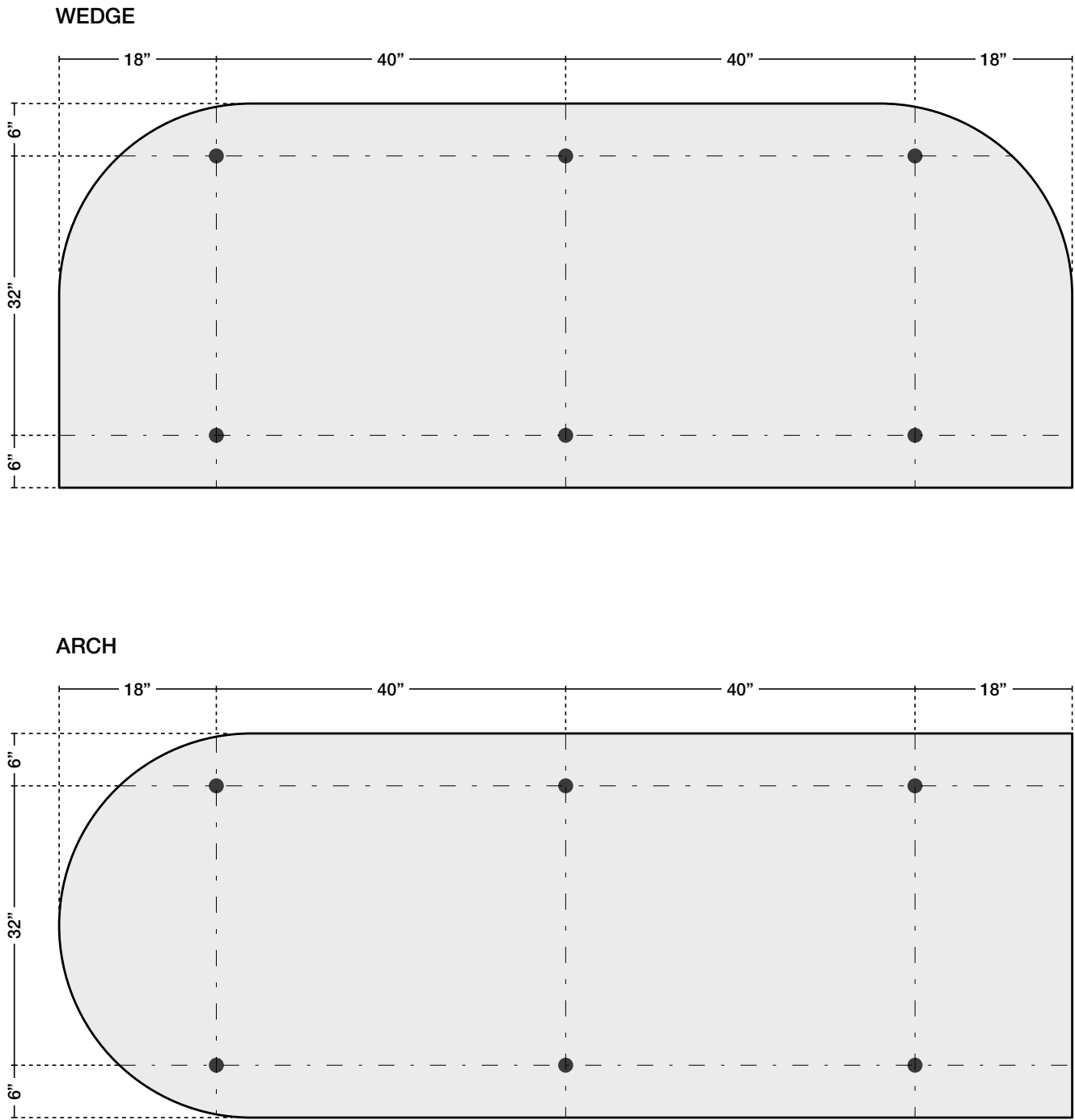
Your connections arrive pre-attached to the back of each panel, but if your install calls for it, they can be repositioned in field.

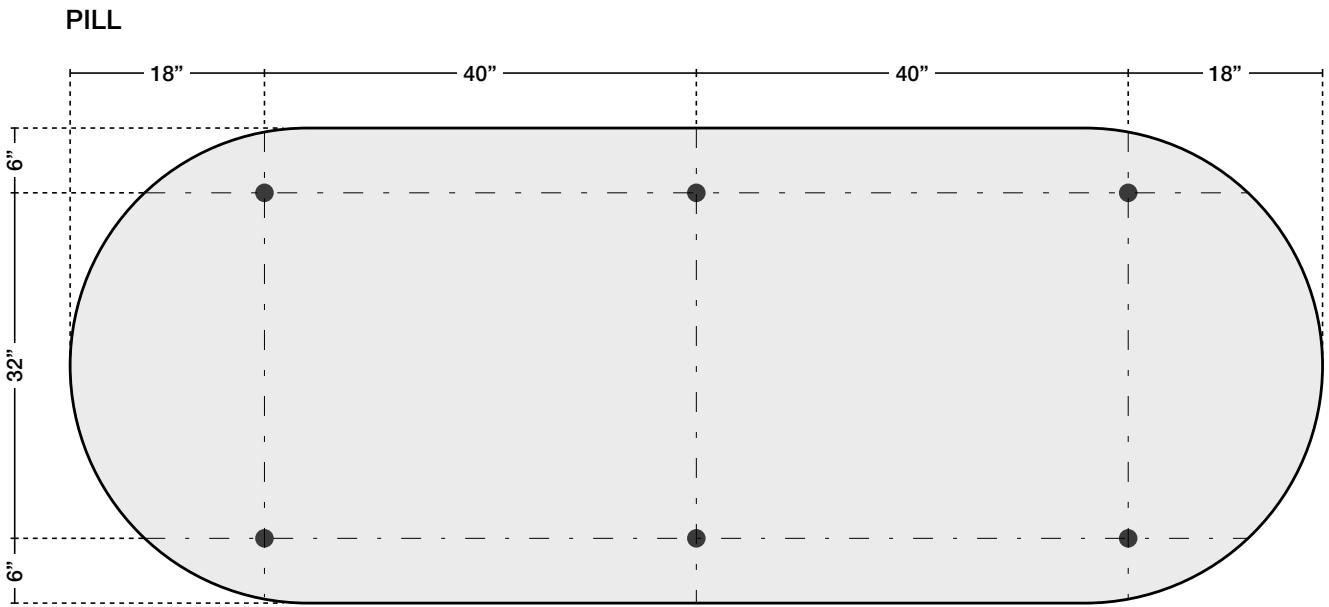

Dot Connections

Dot is small enough to hang from a single connection point, centered on the panel - simple by design.
