She is also the Founder of The Leadership Consortium, a first-of-its kind leadership accelerator that works to build inclusive executive teams and prepare emerging leaders for senior leadership.

Anne's work investigates how leaders create the conditions for people and organizations to thrive. In addition to countless articles and case studies, Anne is the best-selling co-author of *Uncommon Service, Unleashed* and the newly released *Move Fast & Fix Things: The Trusted Leader's Guide to Solving Hard Problems.* Hailed as a "masterpiece on trust, leadership, and business," *Move Fast & Fix Things* inspires readers to accelerate change while also taking care of their employees, customers, and shareholders.

When Facebook made "Move fast and break things" an informal company motto, it fueled the belief that we can either make progress or take care of people, one or the other. Throughout this dynamic, interactive keynote, Anne makes the case that the best change leaders solve hard problems with fierce urgency while making their organizations—employees, customers, and shareholders—even stronger. They move fast and fix things. Based on her work with fast- moving companies, Anne reveals the five essential steps to moving fast and fixing things. Audiences learn to:

- Identify the real problem holding you back
- Build and rebuild trust in your company
- Create a culture where everyone can thrive
- Communicate powerfully as a leader
- Go fast by empowering your team

Building and Rebuilding Trust

Trust is the foundation for everything we do. In this inspiring, hands-on talk, Anne shares battle- tested tools for building and rebuilding high- trust relationships with your most important stakeholders – not in a matter of weeks or months, but by making changes that lead to immediate results. Through both fast-moving discussion of provocative ideas and opportunity for individual reflection, Anne teaches audiences how to how to identify ways they're undermining trust today, along with fast, actionable steps they can take to build more trust tomorrow. Audiences learn to:

- · Increase self-awareness of your own trust "wobbles"
- Strengthen the core pillars of trust: authenticity, logic, and empathy
- Communicate more credibly and persuasively

Creating the Conditions to Thrive

When leaders and aspiring leaders seek out advice, they're often told to try harder. Dig deeper. Look in the mirror and fix your deficiencies. In this inspiring talk, Anne offers a different worldview. She argues that this popular leadership advice glosses over the most important thing you do as a leader: build others up. Leadership isn't about you. It's about how effective you are at empowering other people—and making sure this impact endures even in your absence. Through provocative stories from Ancient Rome to present-day Silicon Valley, Anne makes a persuasive case that the origins of great leadership are found, paradoxically, not in worrying about your own status and advancement, but in the unrelenting focus on other people's potential. Audiences learn to:

- · Unleash the full potential of the people around you
- · Create work environments where other people can reliably excel
- Lead in your "presence" by setting high standards and revealing deep devotion
- · Lead in your "absence" by optimizing strategy and culture
- Increase your confidence and overcome self-limiting beliefs
