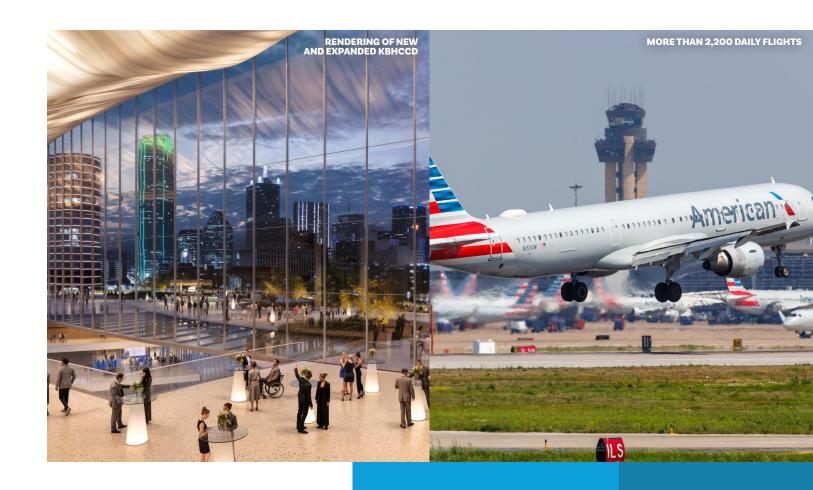

NEW AND EXPANDED CONVENTION

Anticipated to open in 2029, the new and expanded Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center Dallas will transform the city's urban core and anchor a walkable entertainment district with new hotels. A contract for architectural, engineering and design services for a portion of the Convention Center Expansion was awarded to Perkins&Will and Populous. Perkins&Will and Populous have committed to over 50% minority-and women-owned business enterprise (M/WBE) participation. The reimagined center will offer significantly expanded exhibit, breakout, and ballroom space to elevate Dallas as a premier destination for major events.

Dallas is home to two international airports and two major airlines— Dallas Fort Worth International Airport (DFW), Dallas Love Field, American Airlines, and Southwest Airlines. With over 2,200 daily flights to 250 destinations, it's one of America's most connected cities. DFW is the third busiest airport in the world and was recently named the best large airport in North America by Airports Council International (ACI) World.

Looking to the future, DFW has several projects in the works, including a \$4 billion planned investment in Terminal F to create what will be DFW's signature terminal experience, operated entirely by American Airlines.

Dallas is home to the nation's largest arts district—an unmatched hub of museums, galleries, and performing arts. With more Pritzker Prize-designed buildings than anywhere else, the Dallas Arts District has been named the Best Arts District by USA Today readers for the second year in a row.

FUTURE-FACING INNOVATIVE AUDACITY

Netflix House is set to debut at Galleria Dallas, transforming a 107,000-square-foot former department store into an immersive venue. One of only two planned U.S. locations, it will feature experiences inspired by Bridgerton, Stranger Things, and Squid Game, plus themed dining and exclusive merchandise.

ICONIC SPORTS CULTURE

Dallas will play a central role in the FIFA World Cup 26™, hosting a record nine matches, more than any other city. It will also serve as the official hub for the International Broadcast Centre at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center Dallas. From January to July 2026, the IBC will support 2,000 broadcast professionals and serve as headquarters for FIFA's Host Broadcaster, Media Partners, Content Production, and Football Technology teams.

FUN FACTS

FROZEN The frozen margarita

machine was

invented in Dallas by restauranteur Mariano Martinez in 1971. The original machine now resides in the Smithsonian National Museum of American History.

The integrated CIRCUIT circuit computer COMPUTER chip (which became the microchip) was invented in Dallas in 1958 by Jack Kilby, an engineer at Texas Instruments.

At 52 feet tall, the State Fair of Texas mascot, Big Tex, is the **tallest** cowbou in Texas.

COWBOYS STADIUM

With the roof enclosed, the **Statue** of Liberty could fit inside the Dallas Cowboys' AT&T Stadium.

SHOPPING CENTER

Developed in 1931, Highland Park Village Shopping Center was **America's first planned** shopping center.
