Day 1: New York City

After arriving in New York City, enjoy a walking tour of Midtown, including Fifth Avenue, Rockefeller Center, St. Patrick's Cathedral, and Central Park. Then view a New York institution, the Empire State Building, by night.

Day 2: New York City

Immerse yourself in some of Manhattan's popular neighborhoods, such as Greenwich Village, SoHo, Chinatown, and Little Italy. At the 9/11 Memorial, take time to pause and reflect on the tragic event in American history. Then, cruise around the harbor and get prime views of the Statue of Liberty. You'll also experience electric Times Square—its lights can be seen from space! Cap off your last night in New York with a Broadway show.

Day 3: New York City | Washington, D.C.

Continue on to Washington, D.C. and prepare to experience the energy and excitement of the inauguration firsthand. To get acquainted with the nation's capital, you'll take an expert-led tour of the city that includes stops at the Washington Monument, FDR Memorial, Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial, and the Jefferson Memorial. Then spend some time at the renowned Smithsonian museums, tracing the course of American history before it's your turn to be a part of it. This evening, your group will visit the brightly lit Lincoln Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, and the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

Day 4: Washington, D.C.

The day starts off at Arlington National Cemetery, where you'll watch the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and visit the eternal flame at the President John F. Kennedy gravesite. Stop at the Marine Corps War Memorial, which depicts the famous flag-raising at Iwo Jima during World War II. During a walking tour of Capitol Hill, delve into the legislative and judicial branches of our government at the U.S. Capitol Building and Supreme Court. At night, your group will participate in a fun activity.

Day 5: Washington, D.C.

Become a part of our nation's history as you join fellow Americans on the National Mall for the 60th inaugural ceremony. Experience this landmark event for the executive branch of government, including the oath of office and swearing-in ceremony of the president and vice president, the presidential inaugural address, and the inaugural parade. At the end of this momentous day, you'll celebrate by dining and dancing with fellow EF Explore America travelers from around the country at EF's Inaugural Ball, mirroring a tradition that's taken place since Washington took office in 1789.

Day 6: Washington, D.C.

Discover how spies have influenced history at the International Spy Museum. Then say goodbye to D.C. and depart for home, returning with new perspectives on American history.
