


SACRAMENTO & GOLD COUNTRY

28 acres make up Old Sacramento's historic waterfront. As the first booming business distric in California, it was the site where the founding of the Transcontinental Railroad and the terminus of the Pony Express happened. Today, Old Sacramento thrives as a shopping and entertainment district for visitors near and far.




MARSHALL GOLD DISCOVERY STATE HISTORIC PARK

See where the California Gold Rush began. On January 24, 1848, James Marshall found gold in the water channel below the sawmill he was building with John Sutter (now known as Sutter's Mill) leading to one of history's largest mass migrations. At Marshall Gold Discovery State Historic Park, students can see a replica of this original sawmill and more than 20 historic buildings, including exhibits devoted to explaining the history and contributions of Native Americans and African Americans to the Coloma Valley. There's also an opportunity to pan for gold in the American River!





