Discover firsthand why Venice is known as the Floating City.



Day 1: Fly overnight to Italy

Day 2: Milan | Venice

After meeting your Tour Director at the airport in Milan, journey east to the Floating City of Venice. If time permits, stop in Verona along the way and walk the streets of the fair city where Shakespeare set many of his plays.

Day 3: Venice

On a guided tour of Venice, explore St. Mark's Square (home to a very friendly pigeon population) and see gondolas glide down the Grand Canal. Travel by water taxi to the island of Burano, known for its brightly colored homes and lace work. Learn about the art of glass-blowing during a demonstration by a local artist. Cruise along the city's waterways during a traditional gondola ride.

Day 4: Venice | Bologna | Florence

Continue on to Florence via Bologna. It is the seventh largest city in Italy, and the largest of the Emilia-Romagna region. Bologna is also home to some of Italy's most famous culinary delights (including Bolognese sauce!). Enjoy an interactive, hands-on food themed activity based on a local dish.

Day 5: Florence

Enjoy Florence, the birthplace of the Italian language, opera, and the Renaissance. During a walking tour of the city, pass by classical statues at the Piazza della Signoria and walk across the Ponte Vecchio, a medieval bridge where many famed leather and gold artisans keep shop. Try your hand at a famed Italian painting style during a create-a-fresco workshop, where you'll create a fresco of your own in the traditional way by painting earth pigments onto fresh plaster.

Day 6: Assisi | Rome

Journey to Rome via Assisi, where you'll visit the Basilica of St. Francis, a UNESCO World Heritage site and important Roman Catholic landmark.

Day 7: Rome

On your visit to Vatican City, look up at Michelangelo's breathtaking ceiling in the Sistine Chapel and check out the colorful uniforms of the Swiss Guard, protectors of the Vatican.

Day 8: Rome

During your stay in Italy's capital, explore the world's most famous arena, the Colosseum, where you can almost hear the stamping feet of the crowds gathered for gladiatorial combat. Learn about everyday life in ancient Rome as you walk among the ruins of the Roman Forum, where Julius Caesar gave many of his great political speeches. Then go back to school—gladiator school! Discover what it took to become a Roman gladiator during a hands-on lesson, dress in traditional gladiator garb, and learn what life was like for these historic Italian figures.

Days 9–11: Return home or add extension

Depart for home on Day 9 or extend your trip to Pompeii and Capri. Enjoy an expert-led tour of Pompeii's ruins, visit the picturesque Sorrento region along the Bay of Naples, and feel the wind in your hair during a boat ride around the island of Capri.
