BOSTON COMMON

The Boston Common is the oldest city park in America, established way back in 1640. Today it's a popular spot for relaxing, eating lunch, and throwing a frisbee, but over the years it has also served a wide variety of purposes. It was used as a military camp by the British before the Revolutionary War, and in the early 1700s, it was the site of many public hangings. At various times it has also been used as a mass protest site, a place to welcome visiting dignitaries, and even a cow pasture. A fascinating blend of past and present, The Boston Common offers a glimpse into the ever-evolving story of the city.





TIMES SQUARE

The New York Times building was established here in 1904, and to celebrate the New Year, a fireworks display was organized. It was a close call, however, when one of the fireworks nearly lit a neighboring building on fire. As a result, the decision was made to switch to dropping a ball on the New Year instead (an old time-signaling system from the Navy). This tradition continues to this day, now attracting millions of spectators.
