

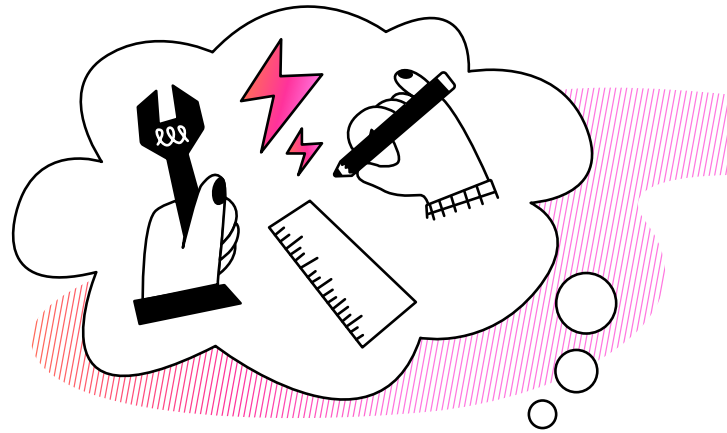


The Group Plan

How it works: Deliver small treats with personalized notes to classmates, teachers, or staff.

- Decide on pricing and create a simple order form or online sign-up.
- Promote your candygrams through school announcements, posters, or social media.
- Deliver items on the chosen day.



Organize a community carwash

🕒 5 hours prep + event 📺 \$10–30 ●●○ Medium effort

How it works: Wash cars for donations in your neighborhood or school parking lot.

- Gather supplies like buckets, soap, sponges, and towels.
- Recruit friends or family to help run the event efficiently.
- Publicize the event locally and suggest a donation amount for each car.



Host a trivia night with ticketed entry

🕒 2–3 weeks 📺 \$0–50 ●●● High effort

How it works: Organize a trivia event related to your tour destination.

- Prepare questions for multiple rounds.
- Promote the event and sell tickets or suggest donations for entry.
- Add prizes, refreshments, or themed decorations to make the night special.
