What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly overnight to South Korea

Day 2: Seoul

 Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Seoul, a contemporary city that stays close to its ancient roots.

Day 3: Seoul | Busan

- Travel by bullet train to Busan, the second largest city in South Korea.
- Visit Gamcheon Culture Village to see beautiful street art and wander through small alleys lined with pastel-colored houses.
- Take a beach train to Cheongsapo, known for its beautiful lighthouses and delicious seafood.
 Then continue on to visit the 14th-century Haedong Yonggungsa Temple and explore the white sands of Haeundae Beach.

Day 4: Busan | Gyeongju

- Enjoy Tour Director-led sightseeing of Busan, and visit BIFF Square, a bustling downtown filled with restaurants and shops. Then find incredible views atop Busan Tower.
- Explore the Jagalchi Fish Market, South Korea's largest seafood market.
- Travel to Gyeongju, once the capital of the Silla kingdom from 57 BCE to 935 CE.
- Learn about the rise of civilization in southeast Korea at the Gyeongju National Museum, and see relics from the Silla kingdom.
- Visit Cheomseongdae, a 7th-century observatory tower that's the oldest surviving astronomical observatory in East Asia.
- Admire the grassy hills in Tumuli Park.
- Enjoy a walking tour of Hwangridan Street, a vibrant neighborhood filled with cafés and traditional hanok exteriors.

Day 5: Gyeongju

- Enjoy Tour Director-led sightseeing of Gyeongju, and see Bulguksa Temple and Seokguram Grotto, the only monuments from the Silla kingdom that remain intact.
- Visit Wolji Pond, where you'll see the stunning grounds of the Donggung Palace.

Day 6: Gyeongju | Seoul

- Travel back to Seoul by bullet train.
- Prepare a traditional Korean meal during a cooking class.
- Explore the narrow alleys and hanoks of the 600-year-old Bukchon Hanok Village.
- Visit the War Memorial of Korea, a museum dedicated to the country's military history.

Day 7: Seoul

- Enjoy Tour Director-led sightseeing of Seoul, and see the Blue House (the residence and office of the President of South Korea) and the Gyeongbokgung Palace, where you'll witness a guard-changing ceremony.
- Explore the National Folk Museum of Korea.
- Visit the traditional Jogyesa Temple.
- Take a walking tour of the Insa-dong neighborhood. Its 100 galleries offer many examples of South Korean fine art, from paintings to sculptures.
- Go on a walking tour of Namdaemun Market, the oldest and largest traditional market in the country that dates back to 1414.
- Venture to the top of N Seoul Tower and enjoy a birds-eye view of the city.
- Enjoy a free evening to explore or take a Taekwondo class.

Day 8: Seoul

- Spend the morning exploring on your own or take a tour of Korea's Demilitarized Zone.
- Go on a walking tour of Myeongdong, a modern shopping district that's arguably the city's most famous neighborhood.
- Enjoy a non-verbal Nanta performance, filled with music and choreography that combines rhythms from folk and modern music.

Day 9: Depart for home

Day 9: Seoul | Jeju

- Fly to Jeju Island.
- Enjoy Tour Director-led sightseeing of Jeju, and see Samseonghyeol, the Jeju Folklore and Natural History Museum, and Yongduam Rock.
- Take a walking tour through the stalls of Dongmun Traditional Market.

Day 10: Jeju

- Hike to the peak of Seongsan Ilchulbong.
- Visit the Haenyeo Museum.
- See the Manjanggul Cave.
- Participate in a candle-making workshop.
- Explore the Seongeup Folk Village.

Day 11: Jeju

- Visit the O'Sulloc Tea Museum.
- Enjoy Tour Director-led sightseeing of Jeju, and see the Yongmeori Coast, Jusangjeolli Cliff, and Cheonjeyeon Waterfalls.
- Explore Yakcheonsa Temple and the Camellia Hill Botanical Garden.
- Enjoy a walking tour of Gwakji Beach.

Day 12: Jeju | Seoul | Depart for home

- Fly back to Seoul before departing for home.
