Take in this tour's highlights

Madrid

Take a walking tour of Madrid with your Tour Director and see iconic sites like Puerta Del Sol, Plaza Mayor, and Mercado San Miguel. Gain an eye-opening perspective on the thriving culture and rich history of Spain's capital city.

Enjoy a fresh tasting of a Spanish staple—churros con chocolate. These golden sticks of sweet fried dough are dipped into hot chocolate to create the perfect bite.

Segovia

Get a glimpse of life as an 18th-century royal and see stunning gardens at the Royal Palace of La Granja de San Ildefonso.

Explore the Alcázar of Segovia, a fortified castle that offers breathtaking views of the countryside and inspired the setting for a famous fairytale.

Make a short stop in the walled city of Ávila, a vestige of Spain's medieval past. The wall served as a physical defense against enemies, a guard against the potential outbreak of plague, and an entrance for imported goods.

Learn how to make yemas, a traditional Spanish custard dessert made of powdered sugar and egg yolks, in an expert-led workshop.

Salamanca

Take a tour of the prestigious Salamanca University and follow in the footsteps of scholars who have walked its halls for centuries.

Salamanca (cont.) Go to the city center to visit the interconnected Old and New Cathedrals, which stand side-by-side as a stunning example of architectural evolution.

Make a quick stop in the medieval city of Cáceres. Take a look at the architectural blend of Roman, Islamic, Northern Gothic, and Italian Renaissance styles through the city's cobbled medieval streets and fortified palaces.

Mérida

Journey to Mérida, the former capital of the Roman province of Lusitania, and uncover some of the most impressive Roman ruins in Spain.

Visit the well-preserved Roman Theater, where gladiators and actors once performed.

Dine on a farm-fresh meal with locals at Gastro Dehesa, a family-run pasture where you'll also learn about sustainability in agriculture.

Stop in Toledo to enjoy the thrill of ziplining and explore the city on your own.
