# Take in this tour's highlights

## Hô Chi Minh City

Glide through a floating market on a traditional Asian longboat, docking alongside vendors to strike a bargain on local goods.

Visit the famous Cù Chi Tunnels, synonymous with the Vietnam War. The tunnels allowed the Viet Cong to control a vital area of South Vietnam and, at the time of the war, stretched all the way from the Cambodian border to Saigon.

Gain a new perspective on the United States' involvement in the Vietnam War on a visit to the War Remnants Museum.

## Mekong Delta

Journey on a full-day excursion of the Mekong Delta and experience its vast maze of rivers, swamps, and island villages by riverboat and sampan (a flat-bottomed wooden boat). Stop in Cái Bè to see how a village can thrive both in water and on land.

## Siem Reap

Discover traditional cooking techniques and a range of Cambodian flavors in a Khmer cooking class.

Visit Angkor Wat, the massive and iconic temple complex containing remnants of the Khmer Empire from the 9th to the 15th centuries. Today it's recognized as the world's largest religious structure.

**Siem Reap (cont.)** Explore the ancient city of Angkor Thom to see ruins left behind by many kings past, like the ornate Bayon Temple, the famed Elephant Terrace, and the Terrace of the Leper King.

Visit a local NGO to learn how its members are giving back to their communities.

## Bangkok

Take an expert-led tour of Bangkok's top sights, like the Grand Palace and the Temple of the Emerald Buddha.

Embark on a boat tour of the more hidden Thonburi canals known as klongs.

Visit Wat Pho, the Temple of the Reclining Buddha, that's covered entirely in precious gold.
