- Return to Washington, D.C.

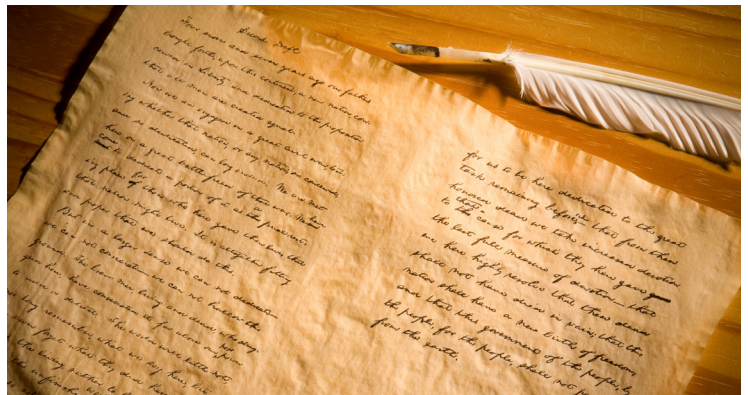
Day 3: Washington, D.C. • Mount Vernon

THE GETTYSBURG ADDRESS

We actually go to the spot where Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address four months after the battle. The tour guide will often have one of the kids recite the speech, and it's always an incredible moment. It really resonates with the kids, because we also visit the Lincoln Memorial back in Washington, D.C., and the Gettysburg Address is engraved into the wall of the memorial. Seeing the words of the speech etched into stone, and then standing in the spot where Lincoln actually spoke those words, it really brings it all together for the kids.

A HOUSE FOR THE PEOPLE

When a contest was held to design the White House, Thomas Jefferson anonymously submitted an architectural plan, and his design resembled a Venetian palace. George Washington said no, this isn't a palace for an emperor, this is a place for the people. Once a design was finally chosen, Washington actually made it five times smaller than it was originally going to be. He wanted to make it small enough that it looked like an appropriate residence for just another man and his family.
