What to expect on this Service Learning Tour

MEANINGFUL SERVICE

Working side by side with locals, you'll gain insight into the challenges they face and build lasting solutions to help empower the community.

Projects include:

- Working alongside locals to help communities, the environment, or education
- Supporting conservation efforts at a local elephant sanctuary

CULTURAL IMMERSION

Stay just outside the communities you serve, celebrating customs and forming lasting connections with locals.

Activities include:

- Participating in cultural activities or games with locals in rural communities
- Discussion with a Buddhist monk
- Experiencing a local market

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Your Tour Director takes your global service experience even further, developing and strengthening leadership skills through activities and workshops.

Exercises include:

- Investigating global issues, exploring social justice, and building leadership skills
- Contextualizing the day's events through thoughtful discussion and group dialogue
- Reflective journaling to deepen the service experience

ITINERARY

Day 1: Fly overnight to Thailand

Day 2: Bangkok

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Bangkok, home of gleaming silver skyscrapers, ancient temples, and serene Buddhist monasteries.

Day 3: Bangkok | Chiang Mai

- Explore the Museum of Siam, an interactive museum that depicts Thai history and culture.
- Take an expert-led tour of Bangkok.
- Take a boat ride through the Thonburi klongs.
- See Wat Arun, the Temple of Dawn.
- Visit Wat Pho, a temple covered entirely in gold leaf.

Day 4: Bangkok

- Take a day tour around the historic city of Ayutthaya, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Fly to Chiang Mai.

Day 5: Chiang Mai

- Tour Chiang Mai with your Tour Director. Visit the intricate Wat Lok Moli temple and wander through a local market.
- Explore Wat Suan Dok temple.
- Participate in a discussion with local monks.
- Visit Wat Phra That Doi Suthep, a hilltop temple famous for its gleaming gold exterior.

Days 6: Chiang Mai | Chiang Mai region

- Travel north to your service project location.
- Tour Elephant POOPOOPAPER Park, a facility that makes eco-friendly paper from elephant dung, and try your hand at the sustainable paper-making process.
- Attend a project orientation to learn more about your service work.

Days 7-8: Chiang Mai region

As communities evolve, so do their needs. That's why we work closely with local nonprofits to better understand each community's issues. Since specific projects are determined closer to your actual tour date, here's what a typical day might look like:

- Explore a community where you'll work with locals on a service project.

- Immerse yourself in cultural activities, celebrate local customs, and learn about community traditions.
- Reflect, discuss events as a group, and draw connections between the day's work and relevant global issues.

Day 9: Chiang Mai region

- Prepare for things to get big, grey, and cute all over on a visit to an elephant sanctuary. Take a walkthrough of your next service project and get an introduction to the complex history of elephants in Thai culture.

Day 10: Chiang Mai region | Chiang Mai

- Focus your service efforts on the upkeep of an elephant sanctuary.
- Travel back to Chiang Mai.
- Explore one of the night markets for dinner.

Day 11: Chiang Mai | Bangkok

- Fly back to Bangkok.

Day 12: Depart for home

3-DAY TOUR EXTENSION

Day 12: Bangkok | Cha-Am

- Travel to Cha-Am.
- Enjoy free time on Cha-Am Beach.

Day 13: Cha-Am

- Take an excursion to Kuri Buri National Park.
- Spend the day enjoying Thailand's natural wonders.
- Observe elephants in their natural habitat.

Day 14: Cha-Am | Bangkok

- Return to Bangkok.
- Explore Bangkok on your own.

Day 15: Depart for home



Your experience includes: 10 overnight stays in hotels (13 with extension); round-trip flights on major carriers; 2 internal flights; daily breakfast and dinner, with lunch on Day 4 and Days 6–8 (with extension: daily breakfast, with lunch on Day 13 and dinner on Day 14); local ground transportation; full-time Tour Director; sustainable service projects; service hours that count towards academic credit; sightseeing tours led by expert guides; entrance fees
