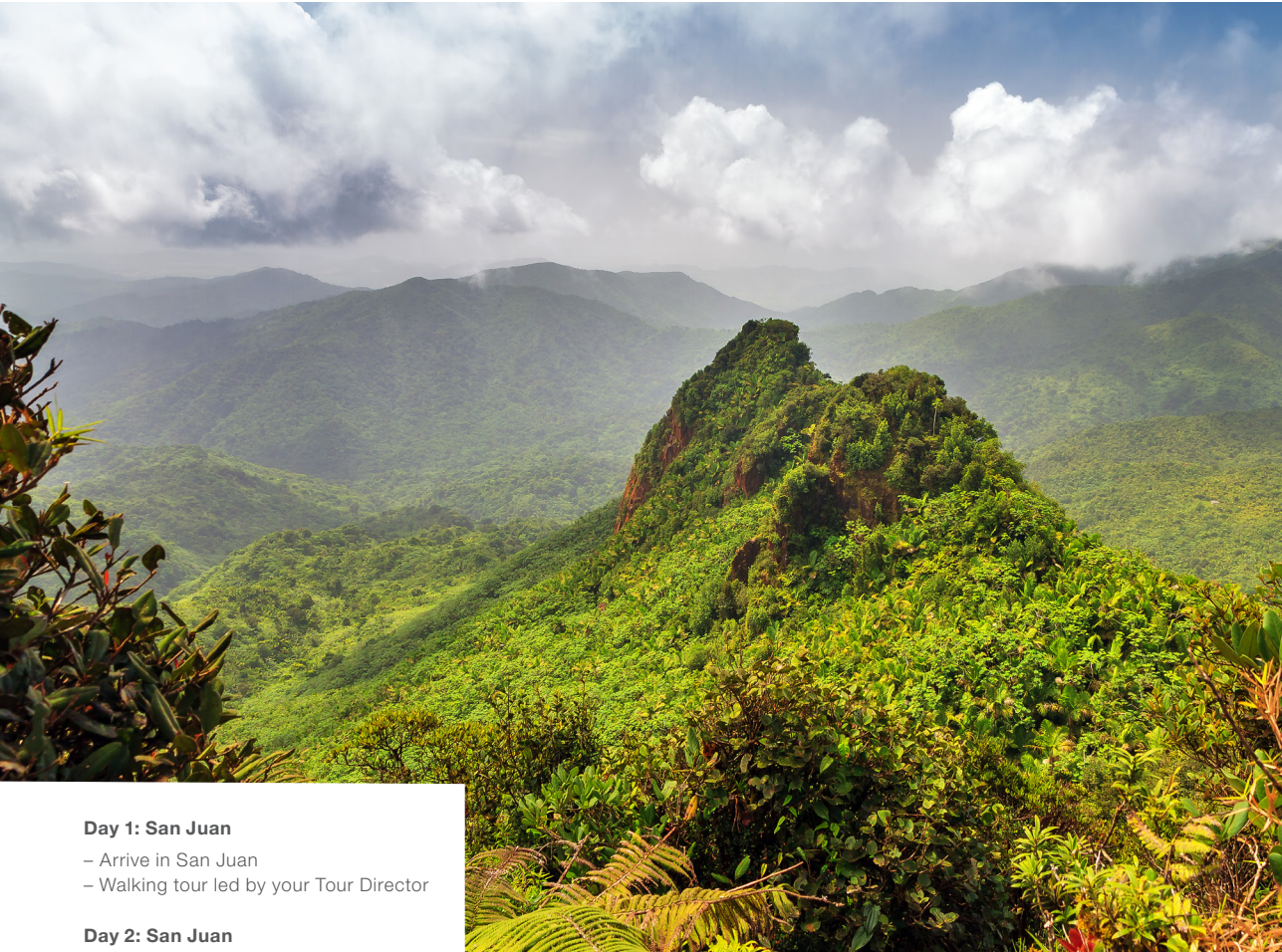

EL YUNQUE

With a name derived from the Taíno word Yuké, referencing its cloud-covered summits, El Yunque enchants on many levels. It's the only tropical rainforest in the U.S. Forest System and is home to over 250 types of flora and nearly 100 types of wildlife, including five endangered species and 13 species of the rare coqui tree frog.



MOFONGO: A TASTE OF PUERTO RICO

Discover Puerto Rico on a plate. This flavorful dish—featuring mashed green plantains mixed with garlic and crispy pork rinds—is often served with a delicious broth or stuffed with meats and seafood. Blending African, Taíno, and Spanish flavors, mofongo showcases the island’s vibrant culinary heritage and makes for a savory, satisfying bite.



EL MORRO

Construction on this Old San Juan fort began all the way back in the 16th century, just 50 years after Columbus arrived in the New World. Overlooking San Juan Bay, the wide open fort has cannonballs, parapets, sentry boxes, tunnels, and staircases to explore. Since the time it was built, the fort has seen more than its fair share of action, having defended itself against everyone from Sir Francis Drake in 1595, to the Dutch, British, and American militaries in the centuries that followed. Today, El Morro is a World Heritage Site maintained by the U.S. National Parks Service.
