MOUNT VERNON

 $Explore\ the\ museums,\ mansion,\ and\ gardens\ of\ George\ Washington's\ Mount\ Vernon\ estate.$ This 18th-century plantation is home to the final resting place of George and Martha Washington, whose tombs can be seen during your visit. Mount Vernon was also once home to hundreds of enslaved people, whose stories are told through specific tours focused on their experiences. By giving an honest portrayal of some of our nation's most shameful history, Mount Vernon hopes visitors will be inspired to work toward a better future.



Day 3: Washington, D.C. • Williamsburg

- Tour the U.S. Capitol and Visitor Center (subject to availability)
- Take a photo stop at the U.S. Supreme Court and the Library of Congress
- Visit the National Archives (time permitting)
- Visit Ford's Theatre and the Petersen House
- Travel to Williamsburg
- Check in to your centrally located hotel

Day 4: Williamsburg • Jamestown

- Enjoy a guided sightseeing tour of Jamestown Settlement: reproductions of original boats used by early American settlers, 17th-century colonial fort, traditional Powhatan Village
- Take a guided sightseeing tour of Colonial Williamsburg: Capitol, Public Gaol, 18th-century tavern
- Enjoy an evening activity

Day 5: Washington, D.C. • Return home

- Travel back to Washington, D.C.
- Explore the Tidal Basin: FDR Memorial, Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial, Jefferson Memorial
- Depart for home




WILLIAMSBURG

Williamsburg was home to the House of Burgesses, which was the first assembly of elected representatives in the American colonies. It was here that the ideas of liberty and democracy were first discussed and debated. Patrick Henry spoke out against the Stamp Act at the House of Burgesses in 1765, and although many people called him a traitor, his radical ideas helped spark the American Revolution.
