STATUE OF LIBERTY

It took more than 10 years to raise enough money to complete the Statue of Liberty. The statue's head was first constructed and placed in the center of Paris, and people were charged a fee to climb to the top of the head and enjoy panoramic views of the city. Around the same time, the statue's arm and torch were sent to America and erected in the middle of Madison Square Park. The public was also charged a fee to climb up for views of the city (at the time, it was the tallest view point in New York).
