


# **NEW YORK & BOSTON**

## STATUE OF LIBERTY

It took more than 10 years to raise enough money to complete the Statue of Liberty. Funds were raised by first building the statue's head and setting it down in the middle of Paris—and then charging people to go up to the top of the head and look out on the panoramic views of the city. Around the same time, the statue's arm and torch were sent to America and set up in the middle of Madison Square Park; the public was charged to go up for views of all of New York. At the time, that was the tallest point in the city.
