RADIO CITY MUSIC HALL

New York's world-famous Art Deco theater opened in 1932, with an elaborate stage show featuring Ray Bolger, Doc Rockwell, and Martha Graham. In the decades since, it has hosted unforgettable performances by many of the all-time greats, from the legendary Rockettes at the annual Christmas Spectacular, to countless concerts, network TV specials, film premieres, and award shows. It's not just the performers onstage that are a sight to behold at Radio City—the theater itself is a visual masterpiece of 60-foot-high gold-leaf ceilings, 30-foot chandeliers, curving balconies, and decorative carpeting.


ON BROADWAY


