



# What you'll experience on your tour

#### Day 1: Fly to Panama

 Meet your Tour Director in Panama City, where you'll explore Panama's cultural, financial, and political capital, a bustling metropolis nestled between the Pacific Ocean and a tropical rainforest.

#### Day 2: Panama City

- Ride through the streets of Panama City on a bike tour.
- Take a tour of Panama City. Visit the city's historic district, which dates back to 1519 when Panamá Viejo, or Old Panama, was the first Spanish city founded on the Pacific Coast of the Americas. In 1671, Governor Juan Perez de Guzman set the city on fire before the pirate Henry Morgan could attack and loot it. Remnants are now part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site along with Casco Viejo, which was built on the rubble in the 17th century. Admire the residence of Panama's president before browsing an arts and crafts market.
- Visit the Miraflores Visitor Center and take an in-depth look at the Panama Canal, one of the most influential engineering projects ever undertaken and one of the Seven Wonders of the Modern World. Completed by the United States in 1914, the 51-mile canal not only revolutionized international trade by bridging the Atlantic and Pacific oceans, it also signaled America's emergence as a global superpower. Learn about this modern marvel including how 22,000 workers lost their lives during its 34-year construction—and see it in action at its Pacific entrance.

## Day 3: Panama City | David | Chiriquí region

- Fly to David, then take a bus ride to Boquete.
- Tour a local honey farm, where you'll learn about honeybees, beehives, and beekeeping.
   See how honey is harvested, and how seasons can affect the color and taste of honey—then sample some for yourself. After that, visit a butterfly sanctuary.

#### Day 4: Chiriquí region

- Fly through a Boquete rainforest during a ziplining experience. (Participants must weigh less than 200 lbs.)
- Take in the unique ecosystem of jungle canopies—and awe-inspiring views—as you trek from treetop to treetop amongst a series of hanging bridges. This way-more-than-ajungle-hike is the perfect opportunity for wildlife spotting and a quick botany lesson.

# Day 5: Chiriquí region

- Explore on your own or
  - enjoy a whitewater rafting experience.

#### Day 6: Chiriquí region | Chitré

- Travel to Chitré, one of Panama's oldest settlements named after the native Chitra tribe.
- Participate in *la junta de embarre*, a traditional mud hut building activity. For this traditional Panamanian custom, communities come together to build mud huts as a gift for newlywed couples. Today you'll work with your group to build your own hut and gain a better understanding of Panama's communal culture.

## Day 7: Chitré | Isla Iguana

- Take a day trip to Isla Iguana.
- Visit the Isla Iguana Wildlife Refuge, where you'll learn more about Panama's flora and wildlife, including black and green iguanas.
   Later, explore the beach or enjoy a light hike on your own.

## Day 8: Chitré | El Palmar | Panama City

- Travel via El Palmar to Panama City.
- Explore on your own or
- take a surfing lesson at one of Panama's premier surfing locations.
- Participate in a folklore evening with authentic Panamanian food and a traditional dance show.

#### Day 9: Panama City | Cartagena

- Fly to Cartagena, Colombia.
- Take a walking tour of Cartagena.

#### Day 10: Cartagena

- Take a guided tour of historic Cartagena.
   Visit the Convento de la Popa and San
   Felipe de Barajas Castle with an expert local guide.
- See the unique ecosystems of Colombia's mangrove tunnels on a canoe ride, and learn how local neighborhoods are working to restore the area through reforestation efforts.

## Day 11: Cartagena | Barú Island

- Take a day trip to the beach at Barú Island.
- Relax and reflect with your fellow travelers, and enjoy lunch on the beach.
- Enjoy a dinner experience that includes traditional music or dancing.
