


REVOLUTIONARY ROOTS: BOSTON, NEW YORK & PHILADELPHIA

FORT LEE

Step back in time at Fort Lee, where the American quest for liberty took a dramatic turn. Overlooking the Hudson River, Fort Lee was a critical position during the early stages of the Revolutionary War. Here, students can explore the remnants of the fortifications and imagine the tense moments of 1776, when American forces successfully stopped British ships from navigating the river.

- Evening activity



- The National Constitution Center




