Day 1: Fly overnight to England

Day 2: London

Meet your Tour Director at the airport in London, a city of eight million people that has become one of the world's great melting pots while also maintaining a distinct character that's all its own. Stretch your legs and set out on a walking tour of the city, exploring sites such as Trafalgar Square, the Strand, and Leicester Square.

Day 3: London

During an expert-led tour of London, royal traditions and rich history will greet you at every turn. Admire architectural marvels like St. Paul's Cathedral, check out the royal residence of Buckingham Palace, and snap a picture of Big Ben from the banks of the River Thames.

Then enjoy time to explore the Covent Garden area at your own pace, where you can shop for local crafts or listen to street musicians. Tonight, catch a theater performance in the West End, the city's vibrant arts and entertainment district.

Day 4: Windsor | Stonehenge | London

Today, journey to the English countryside. Explore Windsor Castle, which serves as Queen Elizabeth's weekend escape. Founded in the 11th century, this former fortress is the oldest and largest occupied castle in the world. Visit Stonehenge, the United Kingdom's most mysterious landmark. This ring of massive boulders seems to rise out of nowhere on the misty hills of Wiltshire. Legend says that Merlin built this ring of stones, and many remain captivated by accounts of Stonehenge's supernatural origins.

Day 6: London

Visit the Tower of London, a medieval castle and former prison, and hear the stories behind its historic stone façade. The Tower's most famous occupants—the Crown Jewels—still reside here today. Head to the nearby Tower Bridge, where you can walk over the bridge's glass floor and get a behind-the-scenes peek into the engine room.

Day 6: London

The Knightsbridge neighborhood of London houses some of the city's top museums. Spend your morning here exploring exhibits at the Victoria & Albert Museum, the Natural History Museum, or the Science Museum. Then head outdoors for a walking tour to Hyde Park, where you can spend the afternoon enjoying the park's monuments and trails. Then view England's capital from above while riding the London Eye, a 40-story Ferris wheel.

Day 8: Depart for home
