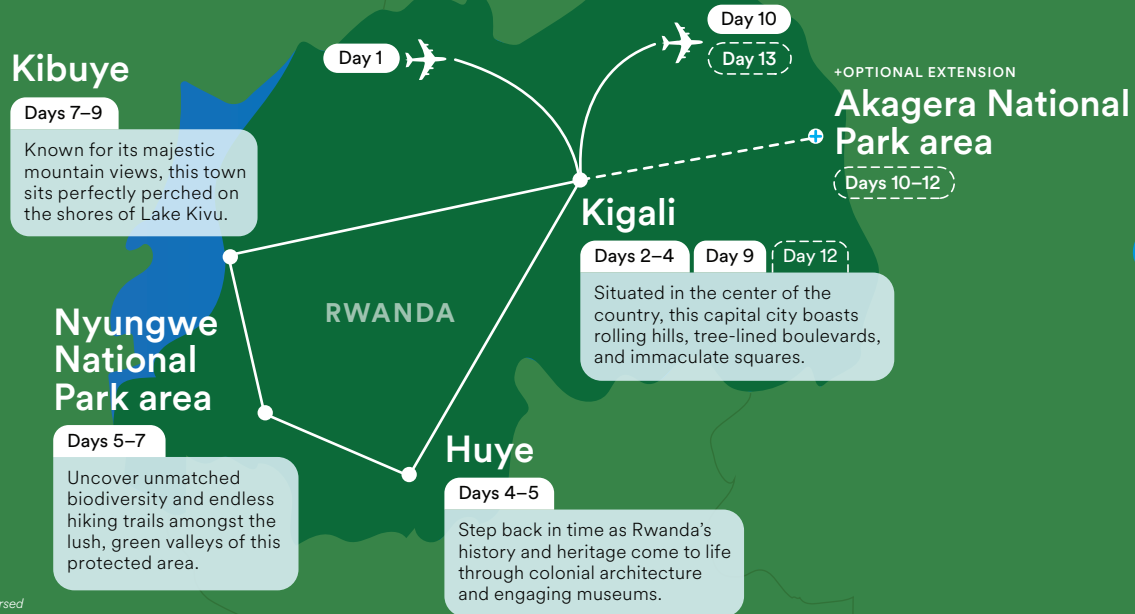

Take in this tour's highlights

Kigali

Join your Tour Director for sightseeing of Rwanda's capital, including a stop at the iconic Kigali sign. Visit Norrsken House Kigali, Africa's largest hub for entrepreneurship. Feel the buzz of creativity and inspiration as you weave through a campus full of repurposed classrooms and brush shoulders with some of the brightest minds in the world.

Visit the Kigali Genocide Memorial, a place of remembrance and education dedicated to the victims of the genocide against the Tutsi in 1994. Honor the memory of over a million lives lost, uncover firsthand survivor stories, and discover ongoing efforts in peace and reconciliation.

Filled with street food, live music, and dancing, take a walking tour of the Nyamirambo neighborhood with an expert local guide. While there, stop at the women's center to take part in a sewing class.

Huye

Partake in a workshop with local artisans and get to know their crafts. Using time-honored techniques and raw materials, try your hand at basket weaving, candle dipping, or hive making.

Visit the King's Palace Museum, a reconstruction of the traditional royal residence that was considered Rwanda's political center before the country gained independence from Belgium in 1962.

Dive deeper into Rwandan history and culture at the Ethnographic Museum, where you'll stroll through galleries displaying artistic and archaeological artifacts.

Nyungwe National Park area

Embark on an adventure through the Nyungwe National Park to spot Rwanda's famous colobus monkeys. (This is the only forest in Africa where they can be seen in huge groups!) Make your way through the region's remarkable flora and keep your eyes peeled for blue, mona, and mangabey monkeys, too.

Enjoy a wildlife hike through the rainforest and admire the birds, orchids, and butterflies you could encounter along the way. Walk along a suspension bridge for an exhilarating perspective of the canopy around you.

Kibuye

Cruise the glassy, emerald green waters of Lake Kivu on a boat tour. Immerse yourself in majestic mountain views and stop on an island for a hike to see a fruit bat colony.

See how coffee goes from fruit to bean to cup as you tour a coffee processing plant (samples included!).

\$ Groups have the option to go sunset kayaking on Lake Kivu, which includes a lesson with expert local guides.

Travel to the Akagera National Park area for guided game drives to spot the Big 5. Then head back to Kigali for more time to explore.
