What you'll experience on your tour

Days 1-2: Fly to New Zealand

- Cross the International Date Line.

Day 3: Auckland

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport.
- Take a tour of Auckland.
- Visit Auckland Sky Tower, the tallest building in New Zealand, where you'll enjoy a bird's-eye view of the city from the observation deck.

Day 4: Auckland | Hokianga

- Travel to Hokianga, one of the earliest settlements of the Māori people in *Aotearoa*, or New Zealand, and home to some of the most picturesque landscapes in the world.
- Visit the Kawiti Glowworm Caves and marvel at the thousands of glowing worms spread across the limestone ceiling as you learn about their life cycles and intricate webs.
- Take a twilight walking tour through the magnificent Waipoua Forest.

Day 5: Hokianga | Paihia

- Embark on the Footprints of Kupe tour, a multisensory journey of guided storytelling, to learn more about New Zealand's famed ancestor.
- Travel to Paihia, the main hub of the Bay of Islands.

Day 6: Paihia

- Keep an eye out for dolphins as you cruise on the Bay of Islands and visit the legendary "Hole in the Rock," a narrow, arched passageway that Māori warriors used to paddle through in their canoes on their way out to battle.
- Take a guided tour of the Waitangi Treaty Grounds and Museum, an important site in both British and Māori history. Later, you'll enjoy a traditional hāngī dinner, complete with a Māori song and dance performance.

Day 7: Paihia | Auckland | Brisbane | Sunshine Coast

- Travel back to Auckland.
- Fly to Brisbane, Australia, then transfer to Habitat Noosa, a renovated summer camp where you're guaranteed to see wild kangaroos!
- Enjoy an afternoon exploring the Sunshine Coast campground.

Day 8: Sunshine Coast

- Explore the mangrove forests of Great Sandy National Park on a full-day canoe excursion.
- Enjoy morning tea and an authentic Aussie BBQ lunch.

Day 9: Sunshine Coast | Fraser Island

- Take a ferry to Fraser Island, a stepping stone to the Great Barrier Reef. While here, be on the lookout for native wildlife, including wild horses, known here as brumbies.
- Explore rainforests, eucalyptus woodlands, sand dunes, and beaches on a Fraser Island excursion led by a National Park Ranger.

Day 10: Sunshine Coast | Surfers Paradise

 Travel to Surfers Paradise, the capital of the Gold Coast and coastal region of southern Brisbane. This area is famed for its long sandy beaches, elaborate system of waterways, and, of course, picturesque surf spots.

Day 11: Surfers Paradise

- Take a free day to relax on the beach or
- enjoy a tour through the Surfers Paradise Hinterland rainforest.

Day 12: Surfers Paradise | Brisbane | Sydney

- Travel to Brisbane.
- Fly to Sydney, a stunning, cosmopolitan city of 4.6 million people that boasts world-class beaches, iconic architecture, and breathtaking natural wonders.
- Take a walking tour of the Rocks neighborhood.

Day 13: Sydney

- Take a walking tour of Sydney.
- Visit the Hyde Park Barracks Museum.
- Enjoy an "Introduction to Opal in Australia" experience.
- Enjoy a guided tour of the Royal Botanical Gardens.

Day 14: Sydney

- Spend the day exploring Sydney or
- explore more of the Sydney Harbour area with a tour of the world-famous Opera House, a visit to Luna Park, and more.

Day 16: Cairns

- Visit Australia's magnificent Great Barrier Reef, one of the natural wonders of the world. Stretching 1,240 miles along the Queensland coast, the reef is nature's largest living organism. It is home to 400 kinds of coral, 1,500 species of fish, and 4,000 types of mollusk. Cruise from Cairns via speedy, airconditioned catamaran to the Outer Barrier Reef and be amazed by the dazzling blue of the ocean around you. After arriving at the pontoon, you can opt to swim, snorkel, or take a glass-bottomed boat ride to view the incredible scenery of this watery world: the electric colors of tropical fish, swaying plants, and exquisite corals.
- Time to see more of the Great Barrier Reef orgo snorkeling with a marine biologist.

Day 17: Cairns

- Full day free to see more of Cairns or
 - take an excursion to Kuranda: Skytrail train and Pamagirri Rainforest Walkabout experience.
