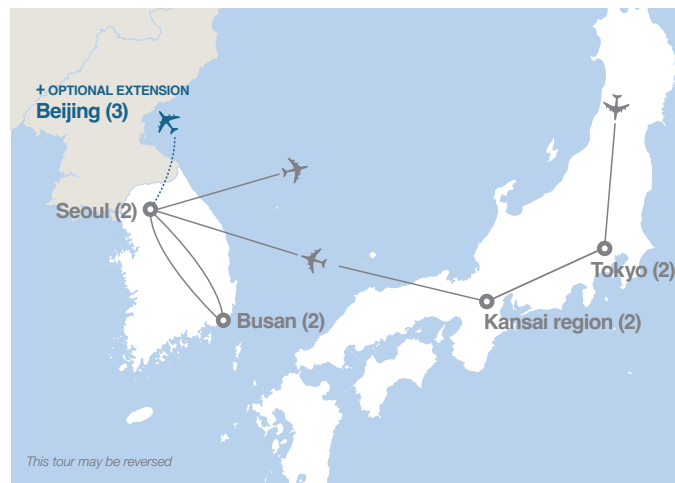

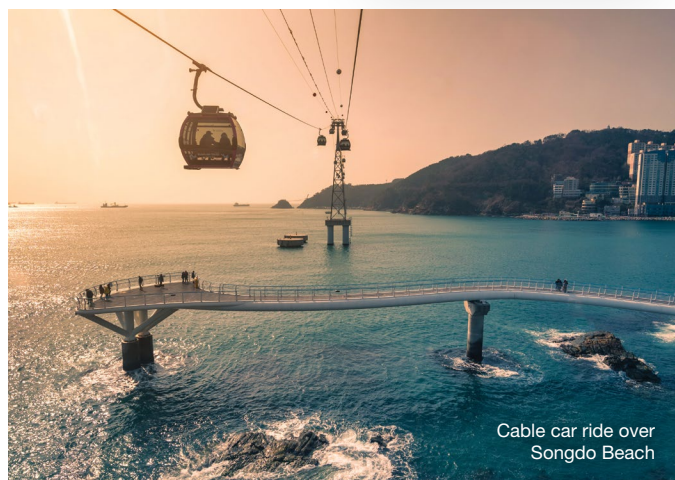

What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly overnight to Japan

Day 2: Tokyo

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Tokyo, a dynamic city that stays close to its ancient roots.

Day 3: Tokyo

- Take an expert-led tour of Tokyo.
- Visit Asakusa Kannon Temple, the city's largest Buddhist temple. Here, restaurants, theaters, and cinemas surround a five-story pagoda a perfect symbol of Tokyo's enduring past and ultramodern future.
- Take a walking tour of Shibuya, a major commercial and financial center with a famously crowded pedestrian crossing.
- Spend time exploring the world-famous Harajuku district.
- Take a tour of Akihabara Electric Town.
- Visit a local arcade and experience Japan's unique gaming culture.

Day 4: Tokyo | Kansai region

- Enjoy time to discover more of Tokyo.
- Travel by bullet train to Kyoto, a city that conjures images of sunlit walks around tiered pagodas and quiet lakes lined with cherry blossom trees.
- Take an expert-led tour of Kyoto.
- Visit Nijo Castle, where the powerful Tokugawa shogunate kept a second home.
- Explore the tranquil Golden Pavilion.
- Take a tour of Arashiyama, including its incredible bamboo forest.

Day 5: Kansai region

- Take a guided tour of Nara, where you'll visit the Todaiji Temple and see the Daibutsu, the world's largest bronze Buddha.
 - Visit the Fushimi Inari-taisha Shrine, located near the base of Mount Inari and originally constructed to honor the god of rice.
 - Explore Kyoto on your own or

Day 6: Kansai region | Osaka | Seoul

- Travel to the Osaka airport.
- Fly to Seoul.
- Enjoy time to explore Dongdaemun Design Plaza.

Day 7: Seoul

- Enjoy Tour Director–led sightseeing of Seoul. See Cheonggyecheon Stream, a scenic urban waterway that winds through downtown, then continue to Cheonggye Plaza, which commemorates the stream's restoration. Visit Gwanghwamun Square, home to statues of Admiral Yi Sun-sin and King Sejong the Great. Explore Gyeongbokgung Palace, where you may have a chance to witness a guard-changing ceremony.
 - Explore the hanoks of the 600-year-old Bukchon Hanok Village.
 - Take a walking tour of the Ikseon-dong neighborhood.
 - Take in panoramic views of Seoul from the Lotte World Tower
 - Explore more of Seoul on your own, or
- ✚ participate in a Korean Martial Arts Experience

Day 8: Seoul | Busan

- Travel to Busan, the second-largest city in South Korea.
- Visit Bulguksa Temple en route.
- Explore Gamcheon Culture Village and its colorful alleys lined with street art.

Day 9: Busan

- Learn about the historical timeline of the Korean War at the UN Memorial Cemetery and Peace Memorial Museum.
- Enjoy a cable car ride over Songdo Beach.
- Stroll through Taejongdae Park and admire its rocky coastline.
- Visit Haeundae Beach, known for its wide stretch of white sand.

Day 10: Busan | Seoul

- Travel back to Seoul by train.
- Learn about the division of North and South Korea at the Odusan Unification Observatory.
- Participate in a Korean cooking class, including a kimchi tasting.

Day 11: Depart for home

Day 11: Seoul | Beijing

- Fly to Beijing, the capital of the People's Republic of China.
- Take a walking tour of a Hutong neighborhood—narrow, interconnected alleyways and courtyard homes that date back to the 13th century.
- Grab a snack from a local street vendor.
- Enjoy a Hutong rickshaw tour.
- Share an authentic Chinese meal with families who live in the Hutongs.

Day 12: Beijing

- Take an expertly guided tour of Beijing.
- Visit the Summer Palace.
- Enjoy a dragon boat ride (April–October).
- Step back in time at the Forbidden City, whose golden-roofed Imperial Palace stands as the largest palatial complex in the world.
- Visit Tiananmen Square, a site of worldwide cultural significance.
- Savor an authentic Peking duck dinner.

Day 13: Beijing

- Visit the Temple of Heaven Park.
- Participate in a tai chi lesson.
- Explore the Great Wall of China—a 3,000-mile man-made marvel originally built to protect the Chinese Empire from northern invaders. Construction began in the 3rd century B.C.
- Take part in a traditional tea ceremony.
