What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly to Chile

Day 2: Santiago

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Santiago, the capital and largest city of Chile surrounded by the snow-capped Andes and the Chilean Coast Range.
- Explore Santiago on a guided sightseeing tour.

Day 3: Santiago | Valparaiso

- Travel to Valparaiso, a colorful and bohemian city known for its artistic vibe and relaxed lifestyle.
- Participate in a cultural experience.
- Enjoy free time to explore Valparaiso or
 participate in a street art workshop.
- Take an expertly guided sightseeing tour of Valparaiso and later, explore Viña del Mar, a resort town that is just a short drive away and is famous for its beaches.

Day 4: Calama

- Board your fight to Calama, a city in the Atacama Desert and former mining town.
- Take an excursion to El Valle de la Luna, or "Moon Valley," a fascinating area of stones, sand formations, color, and texture resulting from eons of flood and wind. Trekking across these lunar-like landforms feels like landing on the moon from atop a giant sand dune. Here you'll visit the amphitheater to take in views of the whole Moon Valley and Salt Mountain Range, and experience the awe-inspiring Tres Marias (The Three Maries) clay and salt formations.

Day 5: Calama

- Visit the Atacama Salt Flats, the largest salt flats in Chile, an expanse of ground covered with salt and other minerals that shines brilliantly white under the glistening sun.
- Continue on to Los Flamencos National Reserve.
- Enjoy free time to explore Los Flamencos National Reserve on your own or
- visit Cejar Lagoon.

Day 6: Santiago

- Fly to Santiago.

- Visit a local market.
- Explore traditional Chilean flavors and culinary methods during a cooking class.

Day 7: Buenos Aires

- Fly to Buenos Aires and discover the city where tango was born.
- On your guided tour of Buenos Aires, head to Plaza de Mayo, home to Casa Rosada (the government house). Continue on to San Telmo, the city's oldest barrio, where tango performances abound. Stop in the colorful neighborhood of La Boca, an area once inhabited by immigrants that has become a hub for the city's artists. You can admire the Colón Theatre, one of the world's best-known opera houses. After seeing Palermo, the city's largest neighborhood, you'll see the glamorous Recoleta area, where you can visit the grave of Eva Perón.

Day 8: Buenos Aires

- Participate in a traditional Fiesta Gaucha.
- See a tango show and participate in a dance lesson. There is no Argentina without tango, and there is no trip to Buenos Aires without a tango show. First, sit back and watch the professionals, then partake in a group lesson. Start working on your abrazo now (a.k.a. your "embrace," a.k.a. the essential tango move), because once you're there, you're hitting up the pista, or the dance floor. Don't be afraid to go all out!

Day 9: Buenos Aires | Depart for home

- Take an excursion to the Tigre area.
- Depart for home.

Day 10: Arrive home
