What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly to Ecuador

 Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Quito, the Ecuadorian capital carved into a narrow plateau high above the Andean valleys and beneath the peaks of the Pichincha Volcano.

Day 2: Quito

- On your guided sightseeing tour, explore the colonial quarter of Quito, where wrought-iron balconies and majestic stone pillars grace 300-year-old plazas, churches, and palaces. The area was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1978.
- See Independence Plaza and the Government Palace.
- Visit the Compañía de Jesús church, a Baroque marvel with an ornate interior decked in gold leaf.
- Visit the Intiñan Museum, where you'll discover how the Incas determined the location of Earth's center.
- Take an excursion to the equatorial line.
 If you've ever wanted to stand in both hemispheres at the same time, this is your chance.

Day 3: Quito | Baños

- Travel to Baños.
- Climb the winding staircase alongside the massive Devil's Cauldron waterfall. Be prepared to get wet!
- Take a tour of Baños and see the New and Old Cathedrals.
- Visit an organic chocolate factory. You'll learn how cacao is sourced from indigenous producers, see how the beans are turned into chocolate, and enjoy a variety of samples.
- Try your hand at making traditional Ecuadorian dishes during a cooking class.

Day 4: Baños | Riobamba

- Hike through the Baños forest along the Sendero de los Sauces.
- Travel to Riobamba.
- Visit a rural community and enjoy a traditional homemade lunch with the locals.

Day 5: Riobamba | Cuenca

- Travel to Ingapirca to visit the ruins.
- Continue to Cuenca, the jewel of the Southern Andes and Ecuador's third largest city. Declared a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site in 1999, Cuenca's historic area is a neat grid of cobblestone streets and whitewashed buildings. But the city also embraces modern life, which you will discover at its cafés, galleries, and shops.
- Learn how your food travels from farm to table during a guided visit to the Gastronomic Museum.

Day 6: Cuenca

- Take a Tour Director-led walking tour of Cuenca, where you'll see the Old Cathedral, New Cathedral, and the flower market.
- Visit the Straw Hat Museum to learn about the history of this traditional accessory.
- Enjoy an interactive experience with a local community outside of Cuenca.
- Participate in a traditional dance lesson.

Day 7: Cuenca | Guayaquil

- Visit Cajas National Park.
- Travel to Quito.
- Travel to the airport for your overnight flight home.

Day 8: Arrive home

Traveling to Quito in Ecuador was an amazing experience. Quito is a unique city with lots to see.
