- Enjoy a night tour of Washington, D.C.: Lincoln Memorial, WWII Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial

MOVING DAY: FROM JAMESTOWN TO WILLIAMSBURG

The settlers' job in Jamestown was to find a decent place to build a town. Unfortunately, they chose swampland. And in the summertime this swampland turned out to be the most mosquito-infested area around. The people decided to move things inland a little bit, and they settled on Williamsburg. Williamsburg flourished. It was the site of the House of Burgesses, which was the first form of representative government in the new colonies. It was here that the ideas of freedom and liberty were seriously discussed and debated for the first time.

THE FLAG IS STILL THERE

The actual American flag that inspired Francis Scott Key to write "The Star Spangled Banner" is on display at the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History. During the War of 1812, Key was on a British ship trying to negotiate the release of some hostages. When he looked out and saw the American flag still flying over Fort McHenry, he was so inspired that he wrote a poem called The Star Spangled Banner. The rest is national anthem history.
