Seoul

Follow your Tour Director to some of the city's best sights. See the Blue House, where the President of South Korea resides, and Gyeongbokgung Palace, where you'll witness a guard-changing ceremony.

STEM Step inside the Robot and Al Museum to get an up-close look at cutting-edge technologies like robotics, augmented reality, virtual reality, and holography.

STEM Discover an experimental and creative approach to transportation at the Hyundai Motorstudio, where you'll see new possibilities that could redefine the future of mobility.

STEM Discover why Seoul is one of the world's leading smart cities, and learn how innovative technology is being used to create new solutions to urban problems.

Travel back in time to the 600-year-old Bukchon Hanok Village, filled with quaint alleyways and traditional wooden houses called hanoks that traditionally housed high-ranking government officials and nobility.

Enjoy a lively meal of traditional Korean BBQ. Over a grill built right into the dining table, work alongside chefs to prepare a variety of marinated meats as well as Korean side dishes, or banchan, which could include kimchi, veggies, rice, and more.

Busan

Experience one of the most innovative ways to travel as you arrive in Busan by bullet train.

Embark on a guided tour and stop downtown at BIFF Square, which serves as the main venue for the Busan International Film Festival. Buzzing with lights, locals, and bites, the weaving rows of unique stalls are a great place to grab some souvenirs and street food.

STEM Discover the complexities of production on an enormous scale when you visit a high-tech manufacturing facility.

Float above the city on a cable car ride over Songdo Beach for a bird's eye view of the city.

Visit Museum One and explore its contemporary art galleries.
