Thank you for being a 2021 Halliburton political action committee (HALPAC) contributor!

As our HALPAC membership grows, so has our charitable giving amount through the PAC match. For every contribution over \$100, Halliburton matches dollar for dollar to a charity of the member's choice. The charitable match contributions extend to hundreds of organizations including children's charities, schools, and medical research centers. Halliburton employees once again proved their generosity in 2021 by contributing \$187,000 to charity.

The extent to which we can be successful in shaping public policy depends on our ability to educate and build coalitions of lawmakers who support our vision. Halliburton employees play an integral part in these education and outreach efforts.
