Thank you for your contribution to and membership in the 2023 Halliburton political action committee, HALPAC!



#### **CANDIDATE SUPPORT CRITERIA**

HALPAC is an important element of Halliburton's ability to build positive relationships and educate elected officials about the issues that affect our company and industry.

Each year, Congress, state legislatures and other elected officials focus on issues that directly impact our company and our ability to do business. As we strive to meet our business goals, our efforts to communicate with and support candidates who share similar values and advocate for policies that will benefit business and our industry, are critical.

HALPAC carefully reviews contribution requests from state and federal government relations staff and suggestions from PAC members. A number of factors are considered when deciding which candidates will receive HALPAC contributions.

#### THESE CRITERIA ARE:

- High Halliburton constituent relationship in state or district (TX, LA, OK, CO, WY, etc.)
- Eeadership/Committee Chairs
- Pro-Business Candidates (based upon voting records)
- Open seats, where pro-business candidate has a chance to win
- 🔞 Races where pro-business incumbent is significantly challenged
- Candidates who vote with us on our primary issues of concern (Energy, Trade, Tax, Environmental, Labor/Workplace/Human Resource)
